

Church Finances 2020

Given the exceptional circumstances this year, I thought you would like to know how this has impacted on church finances. Last year service collections, including any one-off gift aid envelopes together with relevant GASDS Tax recovery, totaled £12,294 and Fund Raising events realised a further £6,554. This year to date those same numbers total £2,634 and £474 respectively: that's a difference of £15,740. With so much uncertainty about the Christmas services and with most of the fund-raising events scheduled for the last 6 months of the year postponed, it is difficult to see how this situation will change very much.

The PCC will be reviewing what can be done and how we can best involve you. They will also be determining what our Free Will Offering to the Diocese for next year can be. The Archdeacons have asked us to at least maintain our offer at the same level as this year, which would mean £41,240.

For the moment, our reserves are healthy, but that is not to suggest that we could sustain deficits of this magnitude for very long.

Tuesday 29th September

On this day, we mark the Feast of St Michael the Archangel. In the 18th century the feast day was combined with those of the other two Archangels - Gabriel and Raphael. This time of year is often referred to as Michaelmas, which is a contraction of Michael's Mass.

The name Michael is a rhetorical question meaning "Who is like God?" and he is regarded as the supreme angel and leader of the heavenly armies. He is almost always portrayed carrying a spear or sword. Michael is referred to several times in the Old Testament and the idea of Michael as prince-protector is clearly a pre-Christian tradition that was adopted by the early church.

Legend has it that Michael the Archangel appeared to fishermen off the Cornish coast in the 5th century AD and hence the small island became known as St Michael's Mount. It was given to the Benedictine order in the 11th century by Edward the Confessor and was a popular pilgrimage site. The church in the nearby village of Barton-le-street is dedicated to St Michael & All Angels and Michael is the patron saint of soldiers, the police and doctors.

Is there any value in remembering the Holy Angels? Well, since they appear to excel us in both knowledge and power, they remind us that we humans are not top of the heap!

READINGS FOR THE PATRONAL FESTIVAL OF ST MICHAEL

A reading from the book of Revelation

War broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels fought against the dragon. The dragon and his angels fought back, but they were defeated, and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. The great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world – he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him. Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, proclaiming, 'Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Messiah, for the accuser of our comrades has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God. But they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they did not cling to life even in the face of death. Rejoice then, you heavens and those who dwell in them! But woe to the earth and the sea, for the devil has come down to you with great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!'
