Last Sunday we sang "Jesus Christ is risen today" and I noted it was written by Lyra Davidica and others in 1708. In my ignorance, I assumed this was the name of a woman and I began wondering who this early 18th century female was; whose masterpiece could only be sung on one Sunday a year. It turns out that Lyra Davidica is not a person at all, but is the name given to a collection of hymns and tunes published in London in 1708. The title means "Harp of David" and the hymns were mostly translations from the original high German and Latin.

Interestingly, Philip Pullman named Lyra Belacqua, the heroine of his trilogy "His Dark Materials," after the Lyra Davidica.

### **Readings for the Second Sunday of Easter**

Today's **Old Testament reading** from Exodus is rather long and takes up too much space to be reproduced this week.

### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. Acts 4. 32-35

### Hear the Gospel of our Lord, according to John

It was the first day of the week. That evening Jesus' followers were together. The doors were locked because they were afraid of the lews. Then Jesus came and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you!" After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. His followers were very happy when they saw the Lord. Then Jesus said again, "Peace be with you! As the Father sent me, I now send you." After he said this, he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven. If you don't forgive them, they are not forgiven." Thomas (called Didymus) was not with the followers when lesus came. Thomas was one of the Twelve. The other followers told Thomas, "We saw the Lord." But Thomas said, "I will not believe it until I see the nail marks in his hands. And I will not believe until I put my finger where the nails were and put my hand into his side." A week later the followers were in the house again. Thomas was with them. The doors were locked, but lesus came in and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you!" Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here. Look at my hands. Put your hand here in my side. Stop doubting and believe." Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Then lesus told him, "You believe because you see me. Those who believe without seeing me will be truly happy." Jesus did many other miracles before his followers that are not written in this book. But these are written so that you can believe that lesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Then, by believing, you can have life through his name. John 20. 19-31
